## **Installation Instructions**

These instructions are for personnel who are familiar with servicing the product. If you need further details for disassembling or reassembling the product, refer to the appropriate product manual. Contact your nearest Tektronix, Inc., Service Center or Tektronix Factory Service for installation assistance.



**CAUTION.** To prevent static discharge damage, service the product only in a static-free environment. Observe standard handling precautions for static-sensitive devices while installing this kit. ## **Remove the Controller and I/O Boards**

Removing the Cabinet	The cabinet must be removed to access any of the RFA300A measurement set application modules and to access the mainframe modules and cable connectors to the controller board. Use the following procedure to remove the cabinet:		
	. Be sure that you are wearing a static grounding wrist strap.		
	2. Before removing the cabinet, power down the RFA300A measurement s and unplug the power cord.	set	
	B. Disconnect any cables connected to the rear panel connectors of the measurement set. Note their locations for reinstallation.		
	• Put the protective front cover on the measurement set and set the cabine the working surface with the rear panel up.	t on	
	5. Remove the two screws from the handle on the left side of the cabinet (s Figure 1). These screws attach to posts mounted on the power supply module.	see	
	6. Remove the screws from the four rear-panel feet (see Figure 2).

- 7. Use either an adjustable wrench or appropriate size open end wrench as a lever to pry the cabinet loose from the chassis. Loosen each side alternately until the cabinet is released from the EMI gasketing.
- **8.** Slide the cabinet up and off the chassis.

#### Controller Board Removal

1. Remove the nine T15 screws that secure the circuit board retaining plate (see Figure 3), and lift the retaining plate away.

**2.** Remove the two T15 screws that hold the controller board to the mainframe chassis (see Figure 4 for the screw locations).

- **3.** Disconnect the controller board end of all six cables connecting the controller board with the I/O board.
- 4. Disconnect the 6-pin multi-colored cable from the controller board.
- **5.** Carefully pull up on the controller board to loosen it from the backplane connectors.
- 6. When the board is loose from the backplane connectors, lift the assembly up and partially out of the module bay.
- 7. Disconnect the front-panel interface, CD-drive, and floppy drive cables.
- **8.** Place the removed circuit board on a static-free surface or in a protective anti-static bag.

#### I/O Board Removal

- 1. Remove the two T15 screws that hold the I/O board to the mainframe chassis (one on top and the other in the rear panel, similar to the position shown for the controller board in Figure 4).
- **2.** Carefully pull up on the I/O board to loosen it from the backplane connectors.
- **3.** When the board is loose from the backplane connectors, lift the assembly up to gain access to the lower interconnection cables.
- **4.** Disconnect the CD drive ribbon cable from J250 of the I/O circuit board. See Figure 6.
- **5.** Disconnect the IDE hard drive ribbon cable from J150 on the I/O board. See Figure 5.
- **6.** Disconnect the front panel ribbon cable from JR1 on the I/O board. See FIgure 6.

## Install the new Controller and I/O Boards

Controller Board Installation

- 1. Install the new controller board from the kit (039-0147-00) into the backplane as shown in Figure 7, pressing down at the arrows directly above the backplane connectors.
- **2.** Connect the 6-pin multi-colored cable to the controller board as shown in Figure 7. The enlarged inset shows the orientation of the cable, with the yellow wire towards the backplane.

**NOTE**. This cable comes with the controller board assembly; it has no Tektronix part number.

#### I/O Board Installation

- 1. Connect new IDE Cable (174-4825-xx) from the kit to J320 "IDE IN" on the new I/O board supplied in the kit, as shown in Figure 8.
- 2. Connect the new LCD Cable (174-4823-xx) from the kit to J130 "LCD IN" on the new I/O board, as shown in Figure 8.

- **3.** Align the I/O board in the slot behind the controller board and slide it down into positon without pressing it into the PCI connector. Hold the cables up so that they lay over the controller board.
- **4.** Install the LCD cable into the controller board at connector marked "LCD Con" (see Figure 9).

**5.** Install the IDE cable from the I/O board to the controller board at connector marked "Primary IDE" (see Figure 10).

**6.** Install the 6-pin multi-colored (KB MS) cable from the controller board to the I/O board connector marked "PS2" (see Figure 11).

**NOTE**. This cable comes with the controller board assembly; it has no Tektronix part number.

7. Connect the CD-ROM cable to the I/O board at J250, marked "CD-ROM". Be sure the cable retainer latches on both sides of the connector (see Figure 12).

**8.** Connect the hard disk cable to J150 on the I/O board, marked "HDD" (see Figure 13).

- 9. Press the I/O board firmly into the PCI connector.
- **10.** Attach the controller board brackets to the mainframe chassis with two T15 screws each (see Figure 4). Torque the screws to 8 in-lbs.
- **11.** Attach the I/O board bracket to the mainframe chassis with two T15 screws (one on top and the other in the rear panel, similar to the position shown for the controller board in Figure 4). Torque the screws to 8 in-lbs.
- **12.** Place the new circuit board retaining plate, supplied in the kit, in position and secure with eight of the nine T15 screws from the old circuit board retaining plate (see Figure 14). Torque the screws to 8 in-lbs.

#### **Replace the Cabinet**

- 1. Place the protective front cover on the face of the measurement set.
  - 2. Position the measurement set face down on a stable working surface with enough head room to install the cabinet.
  - **3.** Position the cabinet correctly to install it, and slide the cabinet over the end of the mainframe chassis.
  - 4. Slide the cabinet evenly down on the chassis making sure that all of the internal cables are clear and do not catch.
  - 5. When the front of the cabinet comes in contact with the cabinet retaining tabs around the front of the chassis, make sure the edges of the cabinet go under the tabs. You may have to push on the sides of the cabinet to get all of the edges over the EMI strips and under the tabs around the front of the chassis.

- **6.** At the rear of the chassis, you may have to push on the sides of the cabinet to get the rear of the cabinet to fit over the edges of the chassis and EMI gasketing.
- 7. When the cabinet is completely in place on the chassis, install the four rear feet.
- **8.** Position the handle on the left side of the chassis and replace the two screws that attach the handle to the chassis (see Figure 1).

## **Verify Operation**

In order to return your RFA300A measurement set to operating status, you must now perform two procedures.

- 1. Perform the System Recovery procedure, as described in Appendix C of the *RFA300A User Manual* (B020000 and above). Use the new *RFA300A System and Application Restore Media* CD-ROM, supplied in this kit, for the procedure.
- 2. Perform the Performance Verification procedure, as described in Section 4 of the *RFA300A Service Manual*.
